LITTLE SILVER RECYCLING UPDATE 2018

Curbside Collection of Recyclables

Place receptacles to the curb the night before your scheduled collection. Covered receptacles must be no larger than 45 gallons, not to exceed 50 lbs.

Recyclables must be placed to the curb according to the Borough's instructions as stated in this notice. If you do not follow our curbside collection instructions, your recyclables WILL NOT be collected.

In addition, if recyclables are mixed with trash, the County Reclamation Center will refuse to accept entire truckloads of trash and will fine the Borough. **Because of these strict regulations, the Borough will fine residents who mix recyclables with trash or who fail to separate recyclables properly.**

The instructions on the reverse side of this Recycling Update provide information on how to prepare recyclables. It is essential that these instructions be followed.

The Recycling Center is located at the Public Works Borough Garage, 22 Fairview Avenue.

The Recycling Center is open for the convenience of residents of the Borough of Little Silver.
