PERSONNEL (Environmental Commission, Shade Tree Commission, Open Space):  
Mr. Neff made a recommendation to hire Peter Giblin as Police Dispatcher at a salary of  
approximately \$41,000 per year with the usual benefit package. Mr. Neff also moved to exempt  
Mr. Giblin from the anti-nepotism policy noting that he is the strongest candidate, citing his  
participation in the Fire Department and First Aid, his experience as a police dispatcher, and his  
current position as a Class II Special Officer with the Borough. He further noted that it was not  
expected that his father being Police Chief to be a problem, that the chain of command within the  
department will be closely followed, and he will be supervised and evaluated by two superior  
officers. The following Resolution was presented:

**RESOLUTION**

WHEREAS, the Borough Council Personnel Committee has recommended to the Mayor and  
Council that Peter S. Giblin be hired to replace a retiring full time Dispatcher in the Little Silver  
Police Department; and

WHEREAS, Peter S. Giblin is the son of the current police chief, Shannon Giblin, and the Borough  
has in place a nepotism policy precluding the hiring of the relative of a supervisor; and

WHEREAS, the same policy allows for such an appointment on a showing of good cause, and with  
the affirmative vote of at least five of the six Councilmembers; and

WHEREAS, Peter S. Giblin is an outstanding candidate, qualified by education, training,  
experience, and character, and has the full support of the Personnel Committee and the department  
dispatcher supervisors following an extensive selection process including the review of 94  
applications and interviews of the five top candidates; and

WHEREAS, Peter S. Giblin has demonstrated his commitment to the Borough of Little Silver and its residents through service as a First Lieutenant in the Fire Department and First Lieutenant in the Emergency Medical Services, having served with distinction in both volunteer positions; and

WHEREAS good cause exists to exempt Peter S. Giblin from the nepotism policy given his outstanding qualifications, given his knowledge of and dedication to the Borough of Little Silver, given the chain of command within the Police Department making two ranking officers his immediate supervisors, and given the professionalism and acknowledgment of the issue demonstrated by both the candidate and the Police Department during the selection process; and

WHEREAS Peter S. Giblin is a current temporary dispatcher and Class II Special Officer with the Borough of Little Silver; and

WHEREAS, the position of full time dispatcher is an existing job with the need for a replacement due to a retirement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council, not less than five members of the Borough Council voting in the affirmative that, by virtue of his exceptional qualifications and the reasons set forth above, good cause is shown for the exemption of Peter S. Giblin from the nepotism policy, and that Peter S. Giblin is hereby appointed as a full time dispatcher in the Little Silver Police Department effective January 1, 2010.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Little Silver that the sincere thanks and best wishes be extended to Ann F. Mihlon from the “Official Family” and each and every resident of the Borough on the occasion of her retirement.

## **R E S O L U T I O N**

WHEREAS, the Office of the County of Monmouth Engineering Department has concluded its bridge (S-31), known as the Oceanic Bridge, spanning the Navesink River between the Borough of Rumson and the Township of Middletown, is beyond repair and in need of replacement; and

WHEREAS, the Monmouth County Engineering Department has determined that a high level fixed bridge should be constructed over the Navesink River to replace the Oceanic Bridge; such bridge would result in a minimum 55 feet clearance, mean high water to bottom of structure, and a structure height of 70 feet minimum; and

WHEREAS, replacement of the present Oceanic Bridge as proposed above caused very grave concern to the Borough of Rumson, adversely affecting the integrity of the community and its unique character; and

WHEREAS, the present Oceanic Bridge, constructed in 1939, is a graceful, low level, drawbridge that compliments its location; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Little Silver supports the Borough of Rumson who has studied the presentations made by the Office of the Monmouth County Engineering Department and its thesis for this particular proposed design;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that replacing the Oceanic Bridge with a 70 foot high structure would degrade the uniquely historic districts that border both the north and south bridge extremities; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that construction of this type of structure would permanently dominate the vistas that are presently inherent in the Rumson and Middletown waterfronts, as well as being a visual blemish from the water and from the neighboring communities of Fair Haven and Sea Bright; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this construction, with its extremely steep grades, would deprive walkers, joggers and bikers of a venue that has been valued since the origin of the present Oceanic Bridge; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that construction of this type of structure, with its extremely steep grades, would introduce a level of noise pollution never before experienced in this area of Monmouth County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the federal funding required by Monmouth County for this bridge replacement is not limited only to a high level fixed bridge; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that this resolution shall be forwarded to Governor Jon S. Corzine; Governor Elect Chris Christie; U.S. Senator Frank Lautenberg; U.S. Senator Robert Menendez; U.S. Congressman Rush Holt; State Senator Sean T. Kean; State Assemblywoman Mary Pat Angelini; State Assemblyman David P. Rible; Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders, Attention Barbara J. McMorro, Director; Federal Highway Authority, Attention Dennis L. Merida, Division Administrator; Office of the Monmouth County Engineer, Attention Joseph M. Ettore, P.E., P.O. and Inkyung K. Englehart, P.E., Principal Engineer; the New Jersey State League of Municipalities; the Two Rivers Council of Mayors; and the Friends of the Oceanic Bridge Association, Inc., Attention Richard D. McOmer, Secretary.

## RESOLUTION

### Authorizing Disposal of Surplus Property

WHEREAS, the Borough of Little Silver is the owner of certain surplus property which is no longer needed for public use; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Little Silver is desirous of selling said surplus property in an “as is” condition without express or implied warranties;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Little Silver, County of Monmouth, as follows:

- (1) The sale of the surplus property shall be conducted through GovDeals pursuant to State Contract A-70967/T2581 in accordance with the terms and conditions of the State Contract. The terms and conditions of the agreement entered into with GovDeals is available online at govdeals.com.
- (2) The sale will be conducted online and the address of the auction site is govdeals.com.
- (3) The sale is being conducted pursuant to Local Finance Notice 2008-9.
- (4) A list of surplus property to be sold is as follows:

and the odometer reading is 117,108 miles.
- (5) The surplus property as identified shall be sold in an “as-is” condition without express or implied warranties with the successful bidder required to execute a Hold Harmless and Indemnification Agreement concerning use of said surplus property.
- (6) The Mayor and Council reserves the right to accept or reject any bid submitted.

Public Portion: Remarks of the public for the good of the Borough: Frank Procopio, 314 Willow Drive, cited the problem with parking next door. He questioned why this is allowed, that there is no formal authorization for that parking, and noted he had been to previous meetings and the Planning Board. He said nobody is policing the parking lot and building are in disrepair. He presented the original site plan, which complied with all ordinances and requirements. Mayor Castleman replied that is being worked on. Attorney Bennett said it had been addressed by the Planning Board and was resolved, but it has resurfaced. He said he would follow up with the other business’s attorney and advise him that he must apply to the Planning Board for a use variance.
