Message From Mayor Neff

As usual in January, the *Mayor's Message* will be short to make room for lots of start-of-the-year information. Please call Borough Hall or visit www.littlesilver.org or our Facebook page to find out about upcoming events or other town information. Briefly:

- We were sad to learn of the death of **Joan Peer** in December. Joan was a long-time volunteer and a former captain of the then-First Aid Squad, and volunteered in other capacities as well. Please keep her husband, Judge Norman Peer, and her children and grandchildren, in your thoughts and prayers.
- At this writing at the end of December, the number of **new COVID-19 cases** continues to spike, here and elsewhere. We encourage everyone to stay abreast of the news, and to follow your doctor's advice when it comes to vaccinations, boosters, testing and masking. All borough buildings are open and all departments are fully functioning, but the Borough continues to follow CDC guidelines, and is considering converting its annual January reorganization meeting to remote participation only given that it is often crowded. The situation is fluid, so that may change.
- The Borough will be preparing for its **100th birthday in 2023**. We look forward to including every facet of Little Silver in the celebration, and will form a committee to organize the observance. - Please **shovel or salt your sidewalk** as may be called for by inclement

weather. The town clears some school and main walkways, but cannot clear the majority of our sidewalks, especially with the addition of several sidewalks in 2021. Likewise, please remove cars and any limbs or brush from the street when snow is forecast, as required to make way for plowing. And if you've got a fire hydrant nearby, please help our volunteer fire department by clearing any snow cover.

- Please be sure you are signed up for **emergency alerts**, or give a New Year's gift to a neighbor or friend and make sure they are signed up. Go to littlesilver.org and click on Emergency Services, and then Two River Alert – Code Red Notifications, or call 866-939-0911 or borough hall for assistance.
- And lastly, please remove all valuables and **lock your cars** when not in use. Our police advise that making our town less attractive to thieves will keep us all safer.

RECYCLING UPDATE

January 2022

Curbside Collection of Recyclables

Place receptacles to the curb the night before your scheduled collection. Covered receptacles must be no larger than 45 gallons, not to exceed 50 lbs.

Recyclables must be placed to the curb according to the Borough’s instructions as stated in this notice. If you do not follow the curbside collection instructions, your recyclables **WILL NOT** be collected.

NOTE: If trash is mixed in with recyclables, the County Reclamation Center will refuse to accept entire truckloads of recyclables and will fine the Borough. **Because of these strict regulations, the Borough will fine residents who mix trash with recyclables or who fail to separate recyclables properly.**

The instructions on the reverse side of this Recycling Update provide information on how to prepare recyclables. It is essential that these instructions be followed.

REMINDER: No plastic bags are to be placed in recycling or used to hold recycling.

The Recycling Center is located at the Public Works Borough Garage, 22 Fairview Avenue.

The Recycling Center is open for the convenience of residents of the Borough of Little Silver.

4' IN LENGTH AND 12" IN DIAMETER

DURING THE BRUSH COLLECTION PERIOD

**LEAVES ONLY CAN BE PUT TO THE CURB FROM
NOVEMBER 1ST THROUGH DECEMBER 30TH**

THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS WILL BE
PICKING UP LEAVES CONTINUALLY DURING THIS TIME

PLEASE DO NOT MIX BRUSH AND LEAVES,
AS PER STATE LAW THEY MUST BE RECYCLED SEPARATELY

PLEASE HELP US WITH DRAINAGE AND DO NOT PLACE BRUSH OR
LEAVES WITHIN 10 FEET OF A STORM DRAIN
