### Environmental Commission

The Borough of Little Silver has received a grant from Association of New Jersey Environmental Commissions (ANJEC) to construct a small first wash garden (like a rain garden) at Challenger Field Parking Lot. This should catch rain before it runs off and help eliminate the ponding of water in the grassy area of the lot.

The intent of the grant is to promote community engagement and volunteerism and raise awareness of environmental commissions. This will be scheduled to begin in early spring, and we'll need folks to help with the work, as well as local businesses to donate some of the supplies we'll need (various soils, plants, gravel for drainage, etc). **Place covered receptacles to the curb the night before your scheduled collection.**

Recyclables must be placed to the curb according to the Borough’s instructions as stated in this notice. If you do not follow the curbside collection instructions, your recyclables WILL NOT be collected.

**NOTE:** If trash is mixed in with recyclables, the County Reclamation Center will refuse to accept entire truckloads of recyclables and will fine the Borough. **Because of these strict regulations, the Borough will fine residents who mix trash with recyclables or who fail to separate recyclables properly.**

**REMINDER:** No plastic bags are to be placed in recycling or used to hold recycling.

**The Recycling Center is located at the Public Works Borough Garage, 22 Fairview Avenue.**

**CAT & DOG LICENSES DUE BY JANUARY 31<sup>ST</sup>**

During the month of January, Borough Ordinance requires the licensing of all cats and dogs. Licenses can be obtained at the Borough Clerk's Office, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., mailing to Borough Hall or placing in the basket in our vestibule.

The State requires each municipality to conduct a dog census in the Spring. Pet owners who have not obtained a license by that time will be issued a summons by the Police Department, which carries a \$20 fine.

**If you no longer own a cat or dog, contact the Clerk's Office at 732-842-2400 and leave your name, address and pet name so it can be removed from the database or send an e-mail to skavendek@littlesilver.org with all pertinent information.**

**Licensing Instructions**

Fees: **\$12** for cats/dogs spayed or neutered  
**\$15** for cats/dogs **not** spayed or neutered

Submit veterinarian's certificate of spaying or neutering if not previously submitted.

*\* Effective February 1, 2022 one check can be written to include payment for both cats and dogs.*

**PROOF OF RABIES INOCULATION  
 MUST BE SUBMITTED**

Dog owners: Renewals for 2023 dog licenses must have a rabies vaccination date that is valid through **October 31, 2023 or later.**

**Failure to obtain or renew a pet license by January 31<sup>st</sup> will result in a \$5 late fee per pet.**

**Brush Collection**

- \***Brush only** can be put to the curb at any time January 1<sup>st</sup> through October 31<sup>st</sup>
- \*The Department of Public Works will be picking up brush continually during this time
- \*Branches must be no more than 4' in length and 12" in diameter
- \*Christmas trees can be placed to curb at any time during the brush collection period

**Leaf Collection**

- \***Leaves only** can be put to the curb from November 6<sup>th</sup> through December 29<sup>th</sup>
- \*The Department of Public Works will be picking up leaves continually during this time
- \*Please do not mix brush and leaves, as per state law they must be recycled separately
- \*Please help us with drainage and do not place brush or leaves within 10 feet of a storm drain

### Did you know...?

There are several tales of how Little Silver received its name. In one, brothers Joseph and Peter Parker, who settled in this area in 1667 and owned land bounded by Parker's Creek on the south and Little Silver Creek on the north, named their holdings "Little Silver" after their father's (George Parker) estate in Portsmouth, Rhode Island. This has been traced to Little Silver, a village in Devonshire, England.
